The peculiarity of the I-S-E-O Summer School is combining high level lectures with free time, once in a lifetime experiences with Nobel Laureates and other top class speakers. While students have the unique chance to learn, meet and spend free time with Nobels, they also have the possibility to enjoy their stay in Italy with other participants from all over the world.

During the Summer School week participants have also the possibility to visit wonderful Northern Italy cities, such as Venice and the famous Franciacorta region. In the free time students can also try a wide selection of all kinds of watersports in the sporting center at the hotel.

The course takes place in Iseo, which is a small town in Northern Italy close to Milan, Bergamo and Brescia. The town of Iseo lies on the foothills of the Alps just next to the Lake Iseo. The Lake Iseo is a peaceful and romantic lake ("its waters are as sweet as Virgil's ecloques" wrote George Sand, while according to lady Wortley Montagu, "it is the most romantic landscape I have ever seen in my life"). Its shores are shaded by olive and chestnut trees, and the villages overlooking the

lake still retain their century old traits.

The Lake Iseo is also well-known for being very close to the Franciacorta region, a huge vineyard area which produces some of the best Italian wines appreciated in the whole world. Iseo is also very close to Verona (Juliet and Romeo's city), Cremona, Mantua and Venice,

Participants are hosted in a prestigious 4 star hotel located on the lakeside, in a wide tourist and sports resort, featuring a green park, tennis and beach volley courts, swimming pools, a center for sailing, canoeing and windsurfing. Participants are also allowed to borrow bikes from the hotel free of charge to reach the town during the day or evening

Participants are accommodated in double or triple rooms (just a few single rooms are available on request upon payment of a surcharge) that are equipped with minibar, satellite TV, air conditioning and free wifi connection. The hotel has two restaurants that serve typical Italian food. The accommodation for the participants is full board
