Title: "*The New Globalization Agenda*"

Abstract: The "globalization business model" has been the dominant structure for world economic affairs since World War II. The globalization model has been wildly successful by many measures, however, globalization has come under increasing stress in recent years.

This class will begin by examining the root causes of frictions that have arisen on the road to globalization. It then will move on to study policy responses being contemplated and crafted in the United States,

Europe, and China. It will review developments with tariffs and investment constraints and a key focus will be on new industrial policy proposals. Additionally, the class will examine what is being called "The New Washington Consensus". Come to class prepared to express your views on how globalization is impacting your country and region—what you think is working and what is not working.

Lecture **PHOEBE KOUNDOURI** | Athens University of Economics & Business

Title: *"Quantification, Assessment and Monitoring for a Science-based and Innovation-driven Sustainability Transformation"*

Abstract: UN Agenda 2030 are our agreed transformation pathway away from the current era of multiple interconnected crises. The first part of the lecture will connect the dots between the major policy initiatives and showcase actionable strategies for policymakers that can guide EU-wide and national economic recovery in line with the EU's overarching sustainability agenda.

Prof. Koundouri will also argue that the transformation to a sustainable world needs to be science-and-innovation-driven. Special emphasis will be given to the research carried out in the SDSN Global Climate Hub. She will emphasize the need to quantify, monetize, and integrate natural capital considerations into sustainable investment processes and showcase an AI-based platform for ecosystem-services. Prof. Koundouri will also introduce system innovation methods for stakeholder engagement in the co-design and validation of derived transformation pathways and supporting socio-economic narratives.

In the second part of the lecture, Koundouri will dive into theoretical microeconomic underpinnings of decision theory, and based on Koundouri et al.

Abstract: The global economy is undergoing major changes under the influences of many forces and trends, including shocks and diversification, aging, declining productivity, reduced supply elasticity, inflation and rising interest rates. Underneath there are major transformations: the movement of the center of gravity of the global economy eastward, the energy transition, a biomedical and life sciences revolution, and the building of economies on digital foundations. The class will be focused on these and assess the prospectives and risks over the next decade.
